- **Calculators:** Some of the HW problems will require technology for their solution but <u>no</u> exam questions will require the calculator. The following apps will be useful, again for HW and class but **not** on exams:
 - Wolfram "Linear Algebra Course Assistant".
 - *Quick Graph* or equivalent. Quick Graph has a free version. You'll see this in class also.
 - Note: <u>None</u> of these are required but are a big help
